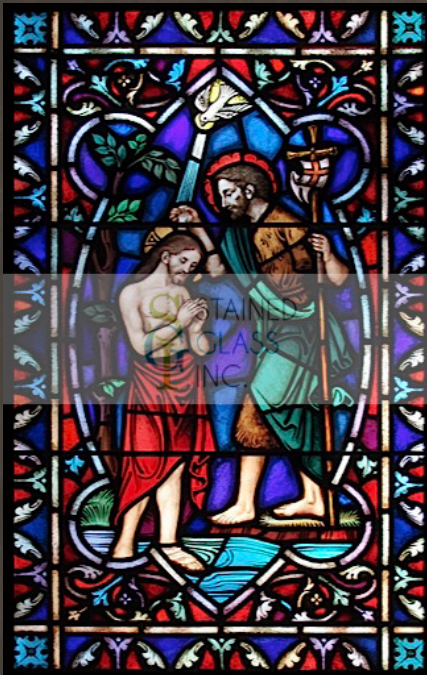


The Baptism of Christ

Baptism

While every moment Christ spent on earth was important, there are several events that are considered particularly crucial in the Christian faith. One of these is Christ's baptism by John the Baptist in the Jordan River. The story has been the inspiration for many stained glass artists. The Story of Christ's Baptism

Every Christian is familiar with the story of Christ's birth, but very little is known about His childhood and early adulthood. It was His baptism in the Jordan River at the age of 30 that marked His emergence to public life as a priest. Accounts of this important rite of initiation are found in the Bible in the Gospels of Luke, Matthew, and Mark.

John the Baptist was a prophet of God who helped prepare the people for the coming of Jesus, urging them to be baptized so they could be cleansed of their sins. Jesus approached John the Baptist and asked the messenger to baptize Him, but John felt he was not worthy, saying Jesus should be the one to baptize him. After receiving words of reassurance from Jesus, John led Him into the river and performed the baptism.
